CHALLENGES:

1. While the activities are open to all students and stakeholders of the university, during the pandemic, it is unfortunate that limited slots were allowed as a contagion measure to prevent the spread of COVID 19.
2. Since our international students speak different languages, it was challenging for us to conduct activities with them.

CONCLUSION:

Incorporating activities that are meant to address immediate needs of the locals and immerse students into voluntary services to produce virtuous, service-minded human resources is the dream of the Poh Teck Tung Foundation, the owner of Huachiew Chalermprakiet University.
