Be World Ready (BWR) is a signature learning program at Niagara College that focuses on international field studies (IFS), semester exchanges, and work/volunteer abroad opportunities all around the world. This program offers the opportunity to experience culturally diverse learning environments, understand different perspectives and practice new skills to develop global competencies. BWR collaborated with NC Sustainability to map all historic and planned BWR trips, incorporate sustainable practices into trips themselves and recruitment activities for the trips. This included providing training materials that help students better understand the SDGs and tips to be socially, economically, and environmentally responsible while travelling abroad. BWR also incorporated the SDGs into a Community Call to Action called *Love in Transit*, that collects gently used adult and children's travel gear (backpacks, duffels, totes, and suitcases) to support citizens who are transitioning from shelter life to independent living, as well as International Development Week, sharing social media posts about different trips and trip activities and the SDGs they support.
