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


The Green Campus Programme

But Bio Green Café is part of a revolution. The café, in UCC's Biosciences Institute, is a p free zone. A progressive pilot project for catering company KSG, the café has no singleu plastic, either in the kitchen or on offer to customers.

Sustainability Officer sits on University's Restaurant Committee.


Catering manager is member of Green Forum. Key to many of the bigger "impact" projects.

- Sustainability officer coordinates (ultimately responsible)
