Case Study: Sustainable Behaviour Assistant

The Brief

The University of Sheffield is a Russell Group University with 26,000 students and 6,000 staff. In line with HEFCE sector-level targets, Sheffield aim to reduce their carbon emissions by 43% by 2020.

On taking up the role of Sustainable Behaviour Assistant, Kim was tasked with delivering Green Impact for the 4th year running. Along with building on prior successes of the project, she has also helped plan and deliver other behaviour change initiatives to improve the University's impacts on the environment.

The Results

- 37 teams across 43 departments completed almost 2,500 greening actions this year.
- The Arts Tower Blackout, a visible demonstration of the University's commitment to sustainability, reduced energy usage by 20%; saving £93 in two days.
- A constant programme of new behaviour change campaigns and initiatives.
