


Scottish Circular Economy business support

Barriers, Solutions and Practice



Barriers

- Requires a systems approach
- Can't act on what you don't know
- Lack of a business case
- Procurement barriers
- The impatient search for a perfect system.
- Existing supply chain reluctance to explore CE
- Fear of failure
- Tendency to 'go it alone'.



Solutions

- Audit current CE activity. Probably more happening than you think!
- Scope possibilities- NHS estimate 50% of their contracts could be circular.
- Start somewhere- go first for the 'low hanging fruit'.
- Build a business case you'll need this to bring others on board.
- Can go 'Semi-Circular' Doesn't have to be perfect straight away.
- **Don't have to do it alone-** work in collaboration.
- **Replicate good practice-** Use networks like EAUC-Scotland!
- Test in real life- Learn by doing.
- Students as innovators- what have students started that can be scaled up?

Student initiatives	Shrub	Collections, free-shop and rental service



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
