What does it cost to send a Malawian child to school? 90kg of fairly traded rice is what a Malawian farmer needs to sell in order to send one child to school. Throughout the Fortnight, MacRobert Foyer, Butchart and the Hub reception will host table top stalls attempting to sell 90kg of Fairtrade Rice and 90ltrs of Fairtrade juice. All proceeds to be donated to the Fairtrade Foundation.
