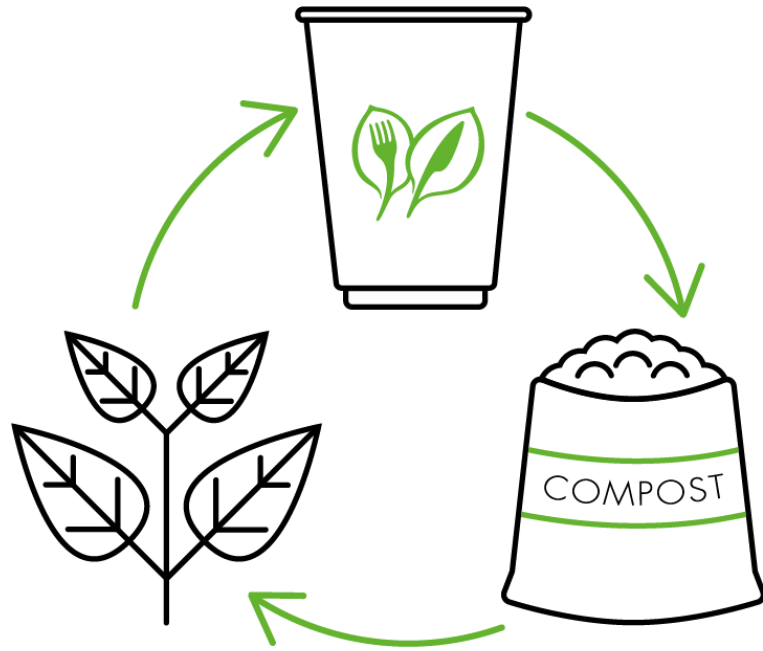

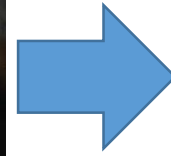


First year uplift costs were high due to the bulky containers and cups
