Sustainable Development is an International Story

Abstract:

This workshop is an inspiring, interactive introduction to enable students to use the essential international component of sustainable development in their future professional field.

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Target group:

Students of teacher training, socio-cultural work, tourism, marketing, product development, journalism,

Selection from the following objectives:

Students have a better understanding of:

- the position of sustainable development in the context of global challenges;
- how different defining factors and actors of sustainable development are connected with each other (systems thinking); ٠
- which position the North holds within the overall framework and which role we are to play; .
- how a contribution can be made by the specific (future) field; ٠
- the relative importance of outgoing mobility. ٠

Students feel involved in the problems, believe in the importance of the contribution of their own professional field and see opportunities. Students are able to:

translate a number of case studies into a project for their target group. •

Approach:

Before the workshop an intake interview takes place with the organising lecturer so that the workshop meets the expectations as well as possible and is embedded in the curriculum. Socio-constructivist teaching method: looking for answers to the key questions of the workshop together with the students. Time is taken to translate the theory into practice, using concrete case studies.

Practical information:

A session lasts 3 hours and costs EUR 140 + transport expenses (cost of public transport and/or car 0.35€ per km) per mentor. The intake interview is free of charge. At least 15 participants.

(Innovating) characteristics: 1) greater efficiency is achieved because the workshop combines both the competences regarding sustainable development and the international competences (*) 2) workshop customised to the training and curriculum; 3) link is possible with outgoing mobility; 4) workshop that meets the efforts for sustainable development and the internationalisation efforts of the educational institution.

(*) Handboek internationalisering, Flamenco, 2013:

4 international competences: 1) language skills, 2) personal growth, 3) intercultural competence and 4) global commitment. Global commitment is translated as world citizenship. In essence, world citizenship implies the pursuit of sustainable development.
