 - ▶ the behaviours / choices made within institutions that determine supply chain specifications and impacts.

- ▶ Expertise and remit on climate change impacts influenceable chain management activity
- ▶ Develop, identify and share good practice / case
- ▶ Review, provide guidance and build resilience to supply chain risks
- ▶ Interlink and report on other groups
- ▶ Engage where possible with the academic community
