



  the way they purchase, use and dispose of clothes.
- We provide easy and practical tips and advice on how to:
  - make your clothes last longer
  - reduce the environmental impact of laundering your clothes
  - deal with unwanted clothes
  - make the most of your wardrobe
- This will help reduce our impact on the environment by reducing the amount of carbon, water and waste created through the manufacture, laundry and disposal of clothing while also helping to save money and resources.





# Love Your Clothes

- Miriam is currently rolling out cascade training to people who can help spread the message. Its normally around a 3 hour workshop, and provides you with tools to run your own sessions
- We also have 15 Volunteer groups and 2 Zero Waste Towns who are getting the training so they can run workshops, presentations and cascade training in their areas.

# Food waste update



- New 5kg and over for food waste producers came into effect 1 January 2016 as per Waste (Scotland) Regulations
- Still very early and little information gathered as yet
- Potentially university catering facilities will be impacted
- Speak to waste contractor if affected

Regulations in Scotland require businesses to separate the following materials for recycling



#### Glass

including rinsed drinks bottles and food jars



#### Metal

including rinsed cans and tins



#### **Plastic**

including rinsed drinks bottles and food containers



#### Cardboard

preferably flattened



#### **Paper**

clean paper only



#### **Food waste**

from food preparation and leftovers

If you don't recycle, the fine can be up to

£10,000

# 5 easy steps to stay within the law...





Look at what you're producing and get the right service from your waste contractor.











Train your staff and label bins.





#### Think before you throw.

Don't mix food waste, recyclables or non-recyclables.



Only use black bin bags for nonrecyclable waste.



You are exempt from separating food waste only if you:

- don't prepare or sell food;
- qualify as a rural location;
- produce less than 5kg of food waste per week.

# **Good Practice Guidance for Preventing Waste Crime**



- Crime associated with waste services is a problem across the UK and beyond and
  it is one that Scotland in particular is taking increasingly seriously. The
  Environmental Crime Taskforce and the Scottish waste industry are working
  together to tackle what has become a multi-million pound criminal enterprise.
- The Good Practice Guidance for Preventing Waste Crime was created jointly between the Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA) and Zero Waste Scotland.
- Through this guidance, we aim to provide public bodies with the tools they need to
  design effective procurement processes that deliver the waste services they
  require while protecting as far as possible from the risk of awarding contracts to
  those engaged in crime.

- Zero Waste Scotland would look to address with the Signatory areas of reported shortfall if deemed necessary

✓	5	Guidance on your legal responsibilities for managing waste.
✓	6	Direction to other waste and recycling services to help you donate unwanted items for reuse or buying quality second-hand products.



## Did you know?

Almost 50% of all food waste in Scotland comes from households. We throw away **630,000 tonnes** of food and drink from our homes every year in Scotland, and **more than half** of this is food and drink we could have eaten.





Wasting this food costs the average household £470 a year, the equivalent of around £39 a month.
