UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)



- 17 goals and 169 specific targets
- Adopted by world leaders in 2015 as part of Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development
- Succeed the *Millennium Development Goals* forged in 2000
- Universal and applicable to all countries

Approximately 1 billion people live in urban slums

- If no meaningful action is taken, this number will double in 30 years
- Responses to this problem have to be multi-level and must acknowledge local cultural, economic, legislative and environmental factors
- Directly linked to 10 of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals
