








Exodus Charity Re-Use Project...



- Formalised as a 'Green Lancaster' project in summer 2010.
- 3.9 tonnes collected via 'crate and trolley' based exercise in 2010.
- 44.9 tonnes collected via major logistical based project in 2016.
- 2011 partnership with Lancashire Community Recycling Network boosted project along with enhanced funding from Lancaster University.
- Green Gown Award in November 2011 in Student Projects and Initiatives category.
- Continued growth and iterative development of the project in line with the Green Lancaster collaborative working of LUSU & Lancaster University







Current Project Logistics...



- Approximate budget; £20 000, consisting of £10 000 staff team, £10 000 project equipment and logistics.
- Team Supervisors recruited April-October; Team Members June-September.
- 7-day operation at peak periods, with 09:00 17:00 shifts.
- Electric Van on hire between May-October.
- 2 x external bin stores designated as a sorting/storage 'base'.
- Site Office cabin leased for team welfare, PPE storage & admin base.
- 'Hypacages' setup at 9 donation stations across campus.
- Marketing & Promotions critical for good communication and clear 'call to action'.
- 45 charities on board in 2016.
- Largest beneficiary, Preston based International Aid with 23.1 tonnes donated,
 54% of total. Critical to success of project, particularly clearing duvets.
