Why climate negotiations?

The IPCC's results are clear :

- •Global warming is human-induced
- •Its impacts are mounting
- •A global phenomenon requires a global agreement

What's happened so far?



- Rio Summit (1992): where it all started
- Kyoto Summit (1997): the first (and yet flawed) binding agreement
- Copenhagen summit (2009): the last big failure

What are the main issues discussed?





What's the situation after Lima (COP20)?



- Consensus reached at the cost of clarity: a vague and flexible text
- Mitigation and adaptation on the same level
- The principle common but differentiated responsibilites was reasserted
- Many questions remain unanswered: financing, reporting, pre-2020 action

What to expect from Paris



- INDCs calendar not fully revealed yet, but there is still much to do
- No reason to wait for a global agreement to start acting locally
- Our leaders will make it important if YOU make it important
