

Design stage	Bottle produced using non-renewable resources, polymers, low quality materials and limited consideration for reuse and circulation.	Bottle produced using renewable, non-toxic and high quality resources and designed with reuse in mind.

Reproduction	Bottle recycled ('downcycled') to a fleece.	Bottle disassembled into technical and biological components:BiologicalTechnical componentsmade into arecycled into a new bottle.biodegradable lunchbox.Image of the second seco
Use #2	Fleece used by owner and later handed to second-hand and used by one or two other users.	Lunch box New bottle used. used.
End-of-life	Fleece disposed of and incinerated releasing dioxins harmful for people and nature.	Lunch box degrades and safely re-enters the biosphere.Bottle recycled into another bottle or new products that re- enters the technical cycle.


Table 1: A Sustainable versus a Circular Bottle



Supply Chain Support: Circular Economy Investment Fund

- £18 million grant fund
- SMEs explore & pioneer circular approaches
- Identify, develop & bring to market
- Collaboration with academia
- Funding projects from £50,000 to £1,000,000
- Operating and/or capital costs



Public Procurement : Mentoring

Procuring for reuse, repair & remanufacturing

- Prioritisation: expenditure, market, review of research
- High: electrical & electronic, furniture, medical devices, construction, textiles
- Medium: catering, cleaning, flooring, power & hand tools, vehicles & tyres, outdoor playground equipment, waste services
- Low: machine tools, lifting & handling, pumps & compressors



Embedding CE in Organisations



- Develop an organizational CE Strategy (BS8001)
- Cross-team working, CE champions
- Pilot projects: a EU Horizon 2020 or Life + project = collaboration, support, funds, and replicable innovative solutions.
- Share Circular Procurement challenges & experiences with peers. New & evolving field.

Embedding CE within procurement

- Early involvement, transparency, clear communication in procurer-supplier dialogues.
- Detailed explanation of CE principles & most preferred options within tenders
- Maximum circularity: product-service models not just products
- Detailed consideration of service specifications prior to contract
- Life-cycle costing is essential


Types of Business Model

- Circular or closed loop supply-chains
- Take-back & buy back schemes
- Sharing Platforms car sharing schemes, WARPit
- Product-service system installation, maintenance and take-back. Producer bears total cost of ownership.
 Ultimate EPR. Extends product life-cycle through maintenance, repair & refurbishment. Philips: pay per lux



Projects in Progress

- NHSScotland: walking aids, catering disposables, vehicle hire, FM
- Scottish Government: office equipment, playground equipment, DPO 'one to many'
- Scotland Excel: tyres, domestic furniture, food & drink
- APUC: food & drink
- Glasgow City Deal: construction/refurbishment


